ANTONY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of meeting of the Antony Parish Council held Thursday 9th Dec 2021 at Antony Village Hall 7.30pm.

61.21 Those present : Cllr Coward, Cllr Shepherd , Cllr Bulmer, Cllr Lobb , Cllr Murray , Cllr Knott, County Cllr Ewert , the Clerk for Antony Parish Council and Mr Knott representing the Wilcove moorings association.

62.21 Apologies. None

63.21 Mr Knott kindly informed the PC of the work of the Wilcove mooring association and current challenges that they faced. It was very informative and the PC thanked him for his time and all his hard work in managing a difficult situation.

He explained that they manage some moorings owned by Antony Estates and some moorings controlled by the Queens harbour master in Plymouth. The QHM licence is per mooring not per boat because all boats are tidal they need a tender for access. Obviously there are issues with this as they are often kept on the foreshore.

The PC discussed concerns made by local residents that the foreshore is currently being used to run a commercial business which is not allowed under the terms of the Antony Estates lease.

Action: Clerk to write to the individual concerned and inform him of these restrictions.

Mr Knott also explained the Wilcove mooring association only had influence over boats that are licenced to them but they can't issue any sanctions.

64.21 County Cllr Ewert Report was received.

"Antony PC Meeting report – 9th December 2021

Kate Ewert – Cornwall Councillor for Rame Peninsula & St Germans

Antony Specific

- I have been contacted by Antony School regarding the issues of the informal one-way system that seems to operate in the lanes around the school and pick up and drop off times. There have been some incidents with delivery drivers getting quite aggressive with parents. I have spoken to Highways to see if this is something that can be made more formal, but it wouldn't be an easy process. I would like the Council's thoughts on whether to progress this further.
- I have also been contacted by several Wilcove residents regarding heavy goods vehicles coming through the village and causing damage to the road. There is little that can be done around this unfortunately.

I was pleased to attend the peaceful protest in Saltash on 30th October, to show the huge public support for keeping the leisure centre open. Around 300 people attended, including Cornwall

Councillors from all political parties. We had many members of the public from Torpoint and Rame in attendance showing how well used the centre is by our residents here. The consultation is now closed, and the matter was discussed at the Customers OSC on Tuesday. The committee agreed that it is all happening far to quickly for interested parties to get business plans organised etc and recommended that the decision is postponed. Cabinet meets next week to decide. We are told there are 9 interested parties in some or all of the centres slated for closure. I am fairly confident that Saltash will remain open.

My twice monthly Cornwall Councillor surgeries continue to be well attended, with housing issues and personal debt high on the list of issues that are being discussed – general advice and signposting as appropriate given to residents. Where appropriate I am intervening with the Council and helping the residents. A few weeks ago, I ran a mobile surgery in Torpoint which was very useful, this involved knocking on doors and speaking to residents about any local concerns they have. I intend to do the same around other Parishes in the division – if any Parish Cllrs would be interested in joining me they would be very welcome.

The CNP focus event on 11th Nov on Health and Social Care was incredibly well attended and interesting. We heard from our local Social Prescribers and the support they are giving in our communities. I am currently working with Jess Hirons regarding running wellbeing hubs across the area – offering joined up support for those residents that really need it.

I am pleased to have been appointed to the Cornish National Minority working group, I attended the first meeting of this a few weeks ago.

We finally had our first Mount Edgcumbe Joint Committee meeting last week, where I was unanimously elected as the Joint Chair. We had a very insightful report from the Park manager where he outlined plans for the Park to help it become more financially sustainable. "

Cllr Ewert noted that the Antony School voluntary one way system could be funded by the Network community fund for 2022/23 if the PC made a case for it.

Cllr Ewert informed the PC that lorries could not be restricted by weight because that would restrict domestic oil deliveries through the village of Wilcove. She also confirmed that they was not a weight restriction order in the village as has been previously thought. As a result CC could not provide signage to this effect.

Highways could contact Carters re: heavy lorries if their activities were damaging the road, like the recurring pothole problem near Beech cottage.

Cllr Ewert did state that if the PC were to declare a Climate emergency, they may be able to influence these activities if they were to have an action plan that included reducing pollution.

Action: Cllr Ewert will chase up Mr Glassup (Cormac) to reschedule the walk through Antony Parish.

Cllr Ewert to attend a meeting with Cornwall housing to discuss ongoing issues.

Cllr Ewert confirmed that it is possible to report a vehicle to Cornwall Council if it has not moved for 6 weeks.

Cllr Ewert confirmed that during the road closure in Antony, traffic lights would be erected in Crafthole.
